Assistant/Associate Professor, Music/Voice

The Faculty of Communications & Creative Arts is pleased to invite applications for the position of Assistant/Associate Professor, Music/Voice. This full-time appointment will begin 2 August 2021.

The Department of Music is seeking a faculty colleague with a strong commitment to undergraduate instruction; evidence of excellence in teaching and the use of innovative pedagogies; knowledge of current trends in pedagogy; and a commitment to performing and creative/scholarly activities. Programmes in Music at the University equip students to be performers, music teachers, church musicians, and prepare them for graduate study. Several music courses also serve as general education courses, and ensembles include students from more than a dozen majors. Current music faculty members are outstanding performers and researchers with strong devotion to our students as well as a commitment to the preservation and proliferation of Bahamian and Caribbean music. We encourage applications from professionals who can help us continue to prepare exceptional and ethical students.

Responsibilities. Teach undergraduate music courses in voice and vocal diction (Italian/Latin, English, French, German), and a core area: music theory or musicianship, and/or related music courses matching the candidate's strengths as assigned by HOD; engage in creative/scholarly work; engage in curriculum review, revision and development; participate in music student recruitment and advisement; and serve on departmental, school, university-wide and external committees.

Qualifications. Candidates must have an earned doctorate in Voice/Vocal Studies or Vocal Performance & Pedagogy from an accredited institution or a Masters degree in one of these areas with extensive professional vocal experience (e.g. a decade performing in opera houses),

tertiary-level teaching experience, a significant record of performance experience, and evidence of recent creative/scholarly work. Candidates with versatility of vocal style and the ability and training to teach in a secondary musical area will be given preference.

Setting. The University of The Bahamas (UB) is a vital catalyst for national development. Chartered on 10th November 2016, UB had its genesis in The College of The Bahamas which was established in 1974. Since 1995, the institution's academic offerings have expanded through the introduction of baccalaureate degree programmes offered across a broad range of approximately 60 majors. Master's degree programmes have included an MBA and an MSc in Reading and Inclusive Education as well as graduate degree programmes offered in collaboration with various US universities. UB operates from the Oakes Field Campus and the Grosvenor Close Centre in New Providence; UB-North in Grand Bahama; and the Gerace Research Facility in San Salvador. Additional sites are planned for throughout the archipelago.
