

## Student Research Symposium 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2018 Call for Abstracts

# Applications will be accepted until Friday, 9<sup>th</sup> March 2018 No late applications will be considered

The Office of the Graduate Studies and Research is calling for submissions for the Annual Student Research Symposium, scheduled for Friday, 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2018 from 9:00 a.m. at University of The Bahamas, Oakes Field Campus. Details regarding submissions and guidelines are available through the Office of the Graduate Studies and Research at research@ub.edu.bs or via telephone at 397-2602.

The Student Research Symposium has been established in an effort to expand opportunities for research and creativity at University of The Bahamas, and to showcase on-going research being conducted by University of The Bahamas students. It is intended that the Symposium will provide a means for undergraduate students to share their research with members of the University of The Bahamas community, its national partners, and government and non-government organizations.

Students enrolled in any undergraduate degree programme at University of The Bahamas are invited to participate. To be eligible for the 2018 Symposium, an undergraduate student must be in good standing with the University and must not have graduated. If a research project is ongoing and will not be completed by 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2018, a research-in-progress summary may be submitted in lieu of an abstract.

- Research that has been presented in another venue is welcome.
- By submitting an abstract, the student agrees to present the research at the Symposium, but may elect not to be included in the competition for **Best in Symposium Awards** to be judged by a panel to include University of The Bahamas faculty and staff, the wider community and members from among University of The Bahamas' local and international partnership listing.
- Final presentations may take the form of a poster presentation, an oral presentation, or a performing/visual arts presentation.
- Awards will be made for the best presentations. Best in Symposium Awards will be designated as follows:
  - Best 100/200 Level Submissions (Undergraduate)
  - Best 300/400 Level Submissions (Undergraduate)



#### **SUBMISSION GUIDELINES AND ABSTRACT PREPARATION**

Abstracts should be typed and be at least 250 words long, but no longer than 300 words. Complete symposium submissions should include the abstract and page 4 of the Call for Abstracts. All documents must be submitted electronically to <a href="mailto:research@ub.edu.bs">research@ub.edu.bs</a> no later than 9<sup>th</sup> March 2018.

- 1. It is expected that the following information will be included in the abstract of the Microsoft Word document of your abstract:
  - a. purpose of the study;
  - b. research method;
  - c. findings; and
  - d. Implications.
- 2. Adjustments to this format to reflect the scholarly traditions of the academic discipline are permitted.
- 3. **Poster or Oral Presentations.** Posters must be displayed on poster boards available for purchase at the University's bookstore. Presenters must be on hand to discuss their projects during the Poster Session. Oral presentations will be grouped by related areas of research. Oral presenters are allotted 10-minutes for a presentation followed by a 3-minute question-and-answer period. A faculty or staff moderator will coordinate each session and may also facilitate the discussion.
- 4. Poster and Oral Presentations will be invited for presentation at the Symposium based strictly on the assessment of the abstracts, and be guided by the following criteria for evaluation:
  - a. clarity of the project goal;
  - b. articulation of research design;
  - c. procedure/methodology; and
  - d. significance of findings.
- 5. **Performing/Visual Arts Presentations** are considered Oral Presentations, since they are executed in the same format up to 10 minutes for a performance/presentation, followed by a 3-minute question-and-answer period. Performing arts presentations may include creative activities in music, dance and theatre, and visual arts presentations can be done in drawing, painting, printmaking, photography, sculpture, ceramics, mixed media, video and film. Performances can be scheduled for live on stage delivery, or presenters can have the performance recorded. A table for artwork displays can be requested for the poster session as well.
- 6. Performing/Visual Art Presentations will be invited for presentation at the Symposium based strictly on the assessment of the abstracts, and be guided by the following criteria for evaluation:
  - a. Description of the performance, in the case of the performing arts, with specific reference to the nature of the script, whether monologue or scenes (up to five actors); solo and small dance ensembles (up to four dancers), works in modern dance, jazz, or ballet. (In these submissions, in addition to the abstracts presenters must include a script/recording.)
  - b. Visual art research question, methodology and outcomes, in the case of the visual arts. (In these submissions, in addition to the abstracts presenters must include a DVD.)
- 7. If the presentation is to include a PowerPoint, the PowerPoint for use on a Windows PC platform must be submitted **no later than 20<sup>th</sup> March via research@ub.edu.bs**. The use of other audio-visual formats must also be cleared with the Office of the Graduate Studies and Research by no later than the 16<sup>th</sup> March 2018.
- 8. Submission of an abstract does not guarantee acceptance to participate in the symposium.
