Ms. Shaquille Sands

Educator Shaquille Sands is a firm believer in the possibility model which considers faith in one's own potential, the abandonment of defeatism, and the willingness to be of service to others as a gateway to achieving and growing beyond expectation.

In her formative years, Ms. Sands was often seen as inquisitive, fearless and mischievous. This was an early manifestation of her desire to engage with the world, test her creativity and carve out her mark. A storyteller from an early age, she excelled at track and field and dance. Because they were important to her personal development, she became committed to extracurricular activities and community engagement. In 2010, she graduated from Charles W. Saunders High School (with Honours) as Deputy Head Girl.

In 2015, Ms. Sands became a proud graduate of The College of The Bahamas (now University of The Bahamas) where she obtained a Bachelor of Education Degree in English Language and Literature. At COB, she served as a part-time beat reporter for the student newspaper, The Spectrum, and taught for several years in the FOCUS programme, a non-profit organization committed to preparing underprivileged public school students for college.

Currently, Ms. Sands is a member of the teaching staff at C. V. Bethel High School where she played a pivotal role in coaching her school's debate team to the semi-finals of The Bahamas National Debate Series, a first-time feat in the school's history. Although relatively new to the teaching profession, Ms. Sands does not regard youthfulness as an excuse to shy away from the demanding and ever changing challenges of teaching and learning. Her classroom walls have become history murals thus serving to motivate her students. To ensure a more inclusive and organic environment, she is committed to defying the method of traditional teaching that dictates a fixed curriculum. As a result, she tailors her teaching to connect to the democratic life where the classroom is viewed as a micro-community that mirrors the wider society.

In addition to being a certified teacher, Ms. Sands is a speech coach, liturgical dance instructor, motivational speaker and mentor.
