Please be advised that UB's transition to online instruction is to facilitate continuity in the delivery of course content. The implementation of other interim measures is also necessary to ensure the fulfilment of academic requirements.

Continuity in Teaching

At UB-North in Grand Bahama, classes will continue uninterrupted online via Moodle.

Also effective on Monday, 16th March, faculty at the Oakes Field Campus who were already delivering courses online will continue to do so uninterrupted.

All other faculty are now required to use the week beginning Monday, 16th March to complete the process of migrating all lecture courses to an online format so that by Monday, 23rd March these courses will be available on Moodle.
