The School of Chemistry, Environmental & Life Sciences is seeking a faculty member who is able to teach bachelor-level content area introductory biology and advanced courses in immunology, and has a strong academic background as well as teaching and research experience. The successful candidates should demonstrate the potential to work collaboratively in establishing a research agenda relevant to the Bahamian context. Candidates should have a strong background in immunology and cell and molecular biology. A strong diverse biology background will be an asset.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Reporting to the Chair of the School of Chemistry, Environmental & Life Sciences, the Assistant Professor, Biology (Immunology) shall:

- Teach bachelor-level content area introductory and advanced courses in biology, immunology, and cell and molecular biology;
- Participate in curriculum review, revision and development;
- Participate in academic advising;
- Engage in research and scholarly activities; and
- Serve on departmental, school and college-wide committees.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

- Ability to work independently;
- Collaborate with colleagues regarding similar research interests and co-curricular activities;
- Ability to work with faculty, staff and students in a professional manner;
- Possess good organizational, communication, time management, and interpersonal skills;
- Commitment to professional development and student success;
- Discretion and judgment when dealing with confidential matters.

QUALIFICATIONS: Candidates must have an earned terminal degree in Biology (Microbiology, Immunology, Parasitology or closely related field) from an internationally recognised and accredited institution and evidence of research and scholarship and a minimum of three years of full-time teaching or research at the tertiary level.

Setting. University of The Bahamas (UB) is a vital catalyst for national development. Chartered on 10th November 2016, UB had its genesis in The College of The Bahamas which was established in 1974. Since 1995, the institution's academic offerings have expanded through the introduction of baccalaureate degree programmes offered across a broad range of approximately 60 majors.
