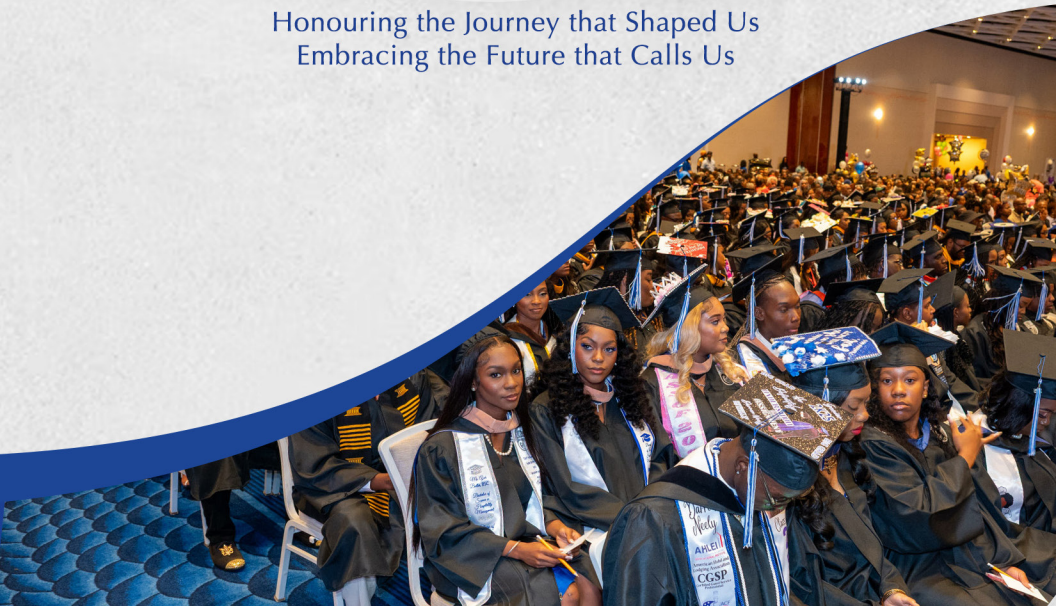

Academic Symbolism

The University Mace

The Academic Ceremonial Mace represents the authority of the Chief Executive Officer of the University. The Mace of University of The Bahamas measures three feet in length and is made from native mahogany for its strength and beauty. It is topped by the University crest flanked by two flamingoes, a symbol of our heritage and brilliance and the national bird of the Commonwealth of The Bahamas. The Mace was designed and carved by Andret John, a noted Bahamian artist who is famous for his sculptures.

The Presidential Chain and Medallion

The Presidential Chain and Medallion are symbols of the rank of President and the authority of the Office of President. The bronze medallion is antique silver-plated and depicts the University's crest. The chain, plain and unadorned, is joined to the medallion by the President's banner, engraved with the name of the University's President. Together with the Mace, the chain and medallion symbolize the continuing authority of the President of University of The Bahamas.

Academic Dress

The wearing of caps, gowns and hoods at college and university functions dates back to the earliest days of the oldest universities. Modern academic regalia evolved from the kinds of apparel worn by monks and students in the eleventh and twelfth centuries to keep warm in the medieval castles and halls in which they studied.

The Gown

The gown has become symbolic of the democracy of scholarship, for it completely covers any dress or rank or social standing. The sleeves of the gown indicate the level of the degree held by the wearer. A long pointed sleeve indicates the bachelor degree. The master's degree gown has an oblong sleeve cut in an arc with a slit at either the upper arm or wrist. The doctoral gown has bell shaped sleeves and may also have velvet facing and three sleeve bars or chevrons. The sleeves of a university president's gown bear four chevrons. The trimming may be black or it may match the degree colour on the gown's edging.

The Cap

The academic cap is a sign of the freedom of scholarship and responsibility and dignity with which scholarship endows the wearer. Old poetry records the cap of scholarship as square, symbolizing the book, although other authorities claim that it is a mortarboard, the symbol of the mason, a privileged guild. Trustees wear a six-sided cap, while the President's is eight-sided. The colour of the tassels on the cap denotes the discipline. The tassels on the mortarboards worn by faculty may be black or a colour indicating the degree. Those who hold a doctoral degree may wear a gold tassel.

The Hood

The hood is the most prominent feature of the academic costume and is lined with the official colours of the institution conferring the degree. It is edged and bound with velvet or the colour appropriate to the degree. At University of The Bahamas, the lining of the hood is royal blue and white representing the University's colours.

The Cord

The gold cord is worn by candidates graduating with distinction. The cumulative grade point average required for the award of distinction is 3.51 – 4.00, effective Fall 1998.

JOY JIBRILU

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

NASSAU & PARADISE ISLAND PROMOTION BOARD

Joy Jibrilu is the Chief Executive Officer of the Nassau & Paradise Island Promotion Board, where she leads the global promotion of one of the Caribbean's most iconic destinations. Appointed in August 2022, she made history as the first female and first Bahamian to hold the position, bringing a strategic, people-centred approach to destination marketing and tourism development.

With more than two decades of experience in public service, Mrs. Jibrilu's career spans tourism, investment, and national development. Prior to joining NPIPB, she served as Director General of the Bahamas Ministry of Tourism and Aviation, where she led the global promotion and development of the country's tourism industry across major international markets.

She also served as Director of Investments at the Bahamas Investment Authority, Office of the Prime Minister, where she played a key role in facilitating landmark tourism developments, including Atlantis Paradise Island, Albany Resort, and Baha Mar.

Mrs. Jibrilu has served on numerous national and regional boards and is widely recognized for her leadership in tourism, economic development, and governance. Her many honours include Caribbean Director of the Year for Tourism, the Caribbean Media Exchange Leadership Award, and Onyx Magazine's 2025 Woman of the Year.

An advocate for sustainable tourism, education, and women's leadership, she currently chairs the Programme Advisory Committee for the School of Tourism and Hospitality Management at the University of The Bahamas.

University of The Bahamas (UB North) Commencement Speaker

Yolett McPhee-McCuin

Yolett McPhee-McCuin, widely known as “Coach Yo”, is one of the most respected and influential leaders in college basketball today. A native of Freeport, Grand Bahama, Coach Yo has become a trailblazer in the sport and a powerful voice for leadership, resilience, and empowerment. As the head women’s basketball coach at the University of Mississippi (Ole Miss), McPhee-McCuin has transformed the Rebels into a nationally recognized program, leading Ole Miss to multiple NCAA Tournament appearances, Sweet 16 runs, and national rankings while becoming one of the winningest coaches in program history.

Beyond the court, Coach Yo is known for her passion for developing people. Through her NoCeilings philosophy, she has inspired countless young women to pursue lives without limits in athletics, education, leadership, and service. Her impact extends throughout the United States and The Bahamas through mentorship, speaking engagements, youth development initiatives, and the NoCeilings with Coach Yo Foundation.

Coach Yo has broken barriers throughout her career. She was the first Bahamian woman to sign a Division I basketball scholarship, the first Bahamian woman to coach at the Division I level, and the first woman in Bahamian history to coach at the men’s national team level. Her accomplishments have earned her induction into both the Bahamian Athletic Hall of Fame and the New England Basketball Hall of Fame. Today, Coach Yo returns home not only as a championship coach, but as a proud Bahamian committed to uplifting the next generation of leaders and reminding them that there truly are no ceilings to what they can achieve.
