KEYNOTE SPEAKER:

The Honourable Zane Enrico Lightbourne

Minister of State, Ministry of Education and Technical & Vocational Training

Zane Enrico Lightbourne was born in the city of Nassau, New Providence, Bahamas. At an early age his parents moved the family to the beautiful island of Eleuthera, where he attended primary school at Green Castle Primary and Rock Sound Primary. He obtained his secondary education at Preston H. Albury High, where he graduated and received his high school diploma.

In 1992 Mr. Lightbourne returned to Nassau to attend the College of The Bahamas, and earned an associate degree in Social Studies, and a Teaching Certificate. His first appointment as a teacher was at the Jack Hayward High School in Grand Bahama in August 1999. After two years of teaching at Jack Hayward, he was appointed to assist in administrative duties as an Assistant Senior Master. In 2007 he returned to the College of The Bahamas and obtained a bachelor's degree in History and Geography, and in 2008 he was appointed Senior Master, and was posted at St. Georges' High School in Freeport where he served for two years before returning to The Jack Hayward Senior High School. In 2013, Mr. Lightbourne returned to New Providence after being appointed as Senior Master to the Government High School.

Mr. Lightbourne's passion for helping people since the beginning of his teaching career led him to run as an executive member of the Bahamas Union of Teachers in 2010 which he won. He successfully served for three years. In 2013 Mr. Lightbourne was elected as the union's Vice President with responsibilities for professional development. He also served as Acting President of the Bahamas Union of Teachers between December 2014 and July 2016. In November 2016 Mr. Lightbourne was elected as General Secretary of the National Congress of Trade Unions Bahamas (NCTUB), for the period 2016-2019. Mr. Lightbourne was posted at the Ministry of Education's School Management section and is also the Secretary General of the Bahamas Educators Managerial Union (BEMU).

Mr. Lightbourne served as a Board Member of the National Insurance Board from 2015-2017. He also served as the President of the Board of Directors of Lucayan Towers North in Freeport Grand Bahama for several years.

Mr. Zane Lightbourne is both a passionate educator and a strong unionist. He is a skilled negotiator, always advocating for the advancement of teachers and the education profession.

Currently, he is the Member of Parliament for the Yamacraw Constituency and Minister of State for Education and Technical & Vocational Training.
