Academic Symbolism

The University Mace

The Academic Ceremonial Mace represents the authority of the Chief Executive Officer of the University. The Mace of University of The Bahamas measures three feet in length and is made from native mahogany for its strength and beauty. It is topped by the University crest flanked by two flamingoes, a symbol of our heritage and brilliance and the national bird of the Commonwealth of The Bahamas. The Mace was designed and carved by Andret John, a noted Bahamian artist who is famous for his sculptures.

The Presidential Chain and Medallion

The Presidential Chain and Medallion are symbols of the rank of President and the authority of the Office of President. The bronze medallion is antique silver-plated and depicts the University's crest. The chain, plain and unadorned, is joined to the medallion by the President's banner, engraved with the name of the University's President. Together with the Mace, the chain and medallion symbolize the continuing authority of the President of University of The Bahamas.

Academic Dress

The wearing of caps, gowns and hoods at college and university functions dates back to the earliest days of the oldest universities. Modern academic regalia evolved from the kinds of apparel worn by monks and students in the eleventh and twelfth centuries to keep warm in the medieval castles and halls in which they studied.

The Gown

The gown has become symbolic of the democracy of scholarship, for it completely covers any dress or rank or social standing. The sleeves of the gown indicate the level of the degree held by the wearer. A long pointed sleeve indicates the bachelor degree. The master's degree gown has an oblong sleeve cut in an arc with a slit at either the upper arm or wrist. The doctoral gown has bell shaped sleeves and may also have velvet facing and three sleeve bars or chevrons. The sleeves of a university president's gown bear four chevrons. The trimming may be black or it may match the degree colour on the gown's edging.

The Cap

The academic cap is a sign of the freedom of scholarship and responsibility and dignity with which scholarship endows the wearer. Old poetry records the cap of scholarship as square, symbolizing the book, although other authorities claim that it is a mortarboard, the symbol of the mason, a privileged guild. Trustees wear a six-sided cap, while the President's is eight-sided. The colour of the tassels on the cap denotes the discipline. The tassels on the mortarboards worn by faculty may be black or a colour indicating the degree. Those who hold a doctoral degree may wear a gold tassel.

The Hood

The hood is the most prominent feature of the academic costume and is lined with the official colours of the institution conferring the degree. It is edged and bound with velvet or the colour appropriate to the degree. At University of The Bahamas, the lining of the hood is royal blue and white representing the University's colours.

The Cord

The gold cord is worn by candidates graduating with distinction. The cumulative grade point average required for the award of distinction is 3.51 – 4.00, effective Fall 1998.

Commencement Speaker and Honorary Degree Recipient

Sir Franklyn R. Wilson, KCMG, CMG

Sir Franklyn R. Wilson, KCMG, CMG, is an astute businessman, visionary land developer, former legislator, and committed philanthropist whose bold leadership and strategic foresight have helped shape the modern Bahamian economy, entrepreneurial sector, and higher education system.

As Chairman of Sunshine Holdings Limited, one of The Bahamas' oldest and most diversified conglomerates, Sir Franklyn has played a leading role in advancing Bahamian ownership and economic empowerment across multiple industries. A qualified chartered accountant, he launched his own accounting firm in 1971 before becoming Managing Partner of Deloitte & Touche Bahamas, a position he held until 1994. His early success in professional services laid the foundation for a career marked by innovation, influence, and impact.

In 1972, Sir Franklyn made history as one of the youngest individuals ever elected to the Bahamian Parliament, following an appeal from Sir Lynden Pindling to join frontline politics. He went on to serve in both the House of Assembly and the Senate, where he held the position of Opposition Leader. His commitment to national development extended far beyond politics, driven by a belief in the power of strong institutions to uplift people and communities.

A passionate advocate for higher education, Sir Franklyn made transformative contributions during his tenure as Chairman of the Council of the then-College of The Bahamas. During that time, the institution expanded its physical and academic footprint, including the acquisition of the Michael H. Eldon Building and a 50-acre land grant from the Grand Bahama Port Authority, which would become the site of UB's Northern Campus. He played a pivotal role in strengthening the university's research agenda and cultivating a culture of academic excellence that set the stage for its transition to university status.

Sir Franklyn holds a steadfast conviction that higher education is a powerful driver of individual and national advancement. He and his wife, Sharon Lady Wilson, a distinguished attorney and former Senate President, have contributed over \$1 million to support faculty research, student achievement, and business education at UB. The Franklyn R. Wilson Graduate Centre, stands as a lasting testament to his commitment. Sir Franklyn, Lady Wilson, and the Wilson Family Foundation, in partnership with UB have also established the Wilson Awards Programme to inspire, recognize, and reward groundbreaking academic research.

A trailblazer in youth and civic development, Sir Franklyn was the founding chairman of both the Bahamas chapters of the Young Presidents' Organization (YPO) and the World Presidents' Organization (WPO), and now has the honour of being Chairman Emeritus of YPO. He also founded Junior Achievement Bahamas, serving nearly a decade as chairman and representing the country as a Director of Junior Achievement Worldwide.

His influence reaches beyond national borders. An alumnus of Dalhousie University, Sir Franklyn serves on the President's Advisory Board and continues to champion global dialogue around education and leadership.

Sir Franklyn's lifetime of service and philanthropy has earned him numerous accolades including the Bahamas Chamber of Commerce Lifetime Achievement Award, the Bahamas Institute of Chartered Accountants Lifetime Achievement Award, and the prestigious Global Trumpet Award presented by the Trumpet Foundation in Atlanta, Georgia.

Commencement Speaker and Honorary Doctorate Degree Recipient

Rt. Hon. His Excellency Lowell J. Mortimer CB, OD, OBE

Rt. Hon. His Excellency Lowell J. Mortimer CB, OD, OBE, is a visionary leader, humanitarian, philanthropist, jurist, and business magnate whose commitment to education, nation building and social equity has left an indelible mark on The Bahamas.

Mr Mortimer's distinguished career began in the public school system as a biology teacher for the Ministry of Education in 1964. Five years later, he answered a different calling – law. After completing his studies at Lincoln's Inn in London, England, he returned to The Bahamas as a Barrister-at-Law, launching a legal career that spanned decades and epitomized excellence in the profession. He practiced law at Darrell Rolle & Co. from 1973 to 1976 and then spent 20 years as a partner at Cash Fountain & Co. before founding his own law firm, Mortimer & Co., in 1996. His legal acumen led him to public service appointments as Acting Stipendiary & Circuit Magistrate, Acting Registrar General, and Chairman of the Copyright Royalty Tribunal.

Mr. Mortimer's involvement in the global shipping industry expanded alongside his legal career, culminating in his appointment as CEO of Campbell Shipping in 2008. He reached another milestone as founder of the LJM Maritime Academy, a state-of-the-art institution that serves as a catalyst for maritime education and industry development.

Over the years, Mr. Mortimer has honoured his roots in education as Chair of the Education Loan Authority; Co-Chair of the National Scholarship Advisory Committee; Member of the College of The Bahamas Council; Trustee of the University of The Bahamas (UB) Board of Trustees from 2016-2017; and Vice-Chair of the UB Board of Trustees. In all these roles he was driven by a profound belief in the transformative power of education. In his leadership capacity at Campbell Shipping, Mr. Mortimer was responsible for COB receiving its single largest gift of \$10 million to establish a small island sustainability science research centre, named after shipping magnate G. T. R. Campbell.

Mr. Mortimer's impact and service extend beyond legal and educational realms to a distinctive record in diplomatic life, including serving as non-resident High Commissioner of the Commonwealth of The Bahamas to India (appointed in 2013) and Honorary Consul-General for the Republic of Turkey to The Bahamas.

His civic involvement is equally extraordinary, marked by his unwavering advocacy and generous philanthropy for marginalized groups. He was a driving force behind the construction of the \$1.5 million Sybil Blyden Centre at the Stapledon School, an all age special education school, in 2011. He is a former Vice President of the Bahamas AIDS Foundation as well as its Chairman for Fundraising and also served as Director of Abilities Unlimited, a non-profit providing meaningful employment to adults with special needs from developmental and health disabilities to substance abuse challenges.

A devoted Anglican, Mr. Mortimer is an active member of Christ Church Cathedral, where he serves on the Vestry and also chairs the church's Endowment Trust.

For his contributions to nation building, Mr. Mortimer was named Distinguished Officer of The British Empire (OBE) on the Queen's Birthday Honours List in 2009, as well as a Companion of The Bahamas (CB). In 2015, the Nassau Guardian named him "Person of The Year". He is also a recipient of the Lady Sassoon Golden Heart Award from the Sir Victor Sassoon (Bahamas) Heart Foundation for his selfless contributions to the betterment of others.
